Growing red-colored bee balm in your garden will increase the beauty of your lawn, and you get to see hummingbirds wandering around it.

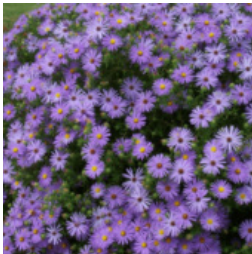


Black-Eyed Susan

Aster

Butterflies are attracted to asters because of their color, fragrance, and shape. Asters come in many colors, including blue, purple, and pink.

Sedum
